

ORDINANCE NO. 1967-3

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE Broadland VOLUNTEER  
FIRE DEPARTMENT: AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF Broadland,  
ARKANSAS:

Section 1. There is hereby created a Volunteer Fire Department  
for the City of Broadland to be officially known as "THE  
Broadland VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT".

Section 2. That the Broadland Volunteer Fire Department  
shall consist of the Fire Chief, Assistant Fire Chief, Captain, Truck Foreman,  
Secretary and Treasurer, and such number of hosemen as the City Council  
may order, but not less than 14.

Section 3. The Fire Chief shall be appointed by the City Council  
and shall receive compensation of \$None per month, and he shall be  
directly charged with the responsibility and accountability to the City for  
all equipment and have control and management of the organization. He shall  
name and select, with the approval of the City Council the members of the  
Department, and shall direct and control all the work of the Department.

Section 4. There shall be held not less than 1 meetings  
each month of the Department for the purpose of instructing and training  
and all members shall attend unless excused for reasonable cause, the regular  
meeting to be held the 15<sup>th</sup> and Monday of each mo. in each month;  
(date) (date) (day of the week)  
that the Broadland Volunteer Fire Department shall adopt such rules

as may be deemed necessary for the proper functioning of the Department, but that all such rules shall be subject to the approval of the City Council.

Section 5. All members of the Burroughland Volunteer Fire Department who have been selected and approved as herein provided, shall receive the sum of \$ None for attendance upon and for service at each and every fire; and shall receive \$ None for each meeting attended; service at each and every fire being deemed to have been performed when the circumstances of such fire are such as to require the necessity of unloading the hose and connecting the same to the fire hydrant.

Section 6. The Fire Chief shall keep a record of the names of the members who attend the monthly meetings and who perform service at each fire, and that he shall submit a full statement of the number of fires attended by each member each month to the City Council at its next regular meeting.

Section 7. All ordinances and this ordinance being necessary for the protection and preservation of the public peace, health and safety an emergency exists and is declared, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.
